ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING

Easter Sunday, April 12, 2020 "You Shall Be Called Repairers of the Breach." (Isaiah 58)

In 1949 a variety of denominations sponsored a radio broadcast calling Christians' attention to the pain of the world after World War II. The program called folks to share sacrificially in their congregations the next morning. They responded so overwhelmingly that what had been intended as a one-time campaign became an annual offering – **One Great Hour of Sharing**. The gifts of this offering support three Presbyterian programs:

36% - Hunger Program

32% - Disaster Assistance

32% - Self-Development of People (Helping victims of floods, earthquakes, fires, droughts, wars, revolutions, etc.)

We will receive the **One Great Hour of Sharing** offering on **Easter Sunday, April 12**.
