#### CHANGE

So much has changed in our lifetime. Can you remember party lines on your telephone or later having a rotary dial system? Can

you remember when a quarter was a big deal—a movie, popcorn and a coke, with change left over? Or, how about when artists sang a song you could whistle or you and the family would gather around a radio to listen to "The Great Gildersleeve?" Our memories of yesterday are so sweet. Life, in retrospect, seemed simpler, safer, special. We ask, when did it change? When did yesterday become today?

We think we are the only ones, the only generation to have experienced this progression into a new age. We aren't. I remember reading Plato's *Apology*, in which he presents the defense Socrates raised to the charges that Socrates had corrupted the youth of Athens with his new way of thinking and searching for the truth. The young people were going to the dogs, they were different, and Athens wanted things the way they were.

The generational change I observe is inevitable; it is the way each new generation asserts and achieves its independence. Yet, in spite of this inevitable change, one thing remains constant, unchanged, no matter how many new generations come: God loves us and will not let us go. Sure, we might say it in new ways; and, we might use new mediums to pass on the gift of revelation and understanding we have been given. But, beginning in Genesis and continuing through Revelation, Scripture teaches, God wants us to be together, to share eternity together, to walk together in the Garden of Eden and in the City on the Hill. A hymn we sing, Immortal, Invisible, has a line that echoes this truth about our God: "Naught changes Thee," and it doesn't.

This virus shall pass, the restrictions and separations will end, and the Gospel will continue. The love of God for us cannot be taken away by the vagaries of nature. God's love will continue, unchanged, just like it always has. Paul sums it up best, "nothing can separate us from the love of God." Nothing!
