Phase One of the Coronavirus Crisis is ending and soon we will be able to come together

again for worship and fellowship. It is not known if this phase will last indefinitely or if there are other phases ahead. As we emerge into what's next, there are steps we must take as we move forward.

- 1. We must <u>assess</u> the damage and address where we need to act first and second and third. We have lost continuity, we have lost income, we have lost our ability to meet in large groups, we have to assure our space and programs are safe, we have to assure all are protected as best we can.
- 2. Next, we must <u>define the new normal</u> that we will work. We have succeeded in our early efforts at cyber communications, but we need to improve. We have developed mechanisms to stay in touch, but they must be improved to include all. We have shown we can reach beyond our walls with our message and our outreach; we must add to this and keep it going. We have learned to be realistic about what we can do; we need to further define that ability and build upon it.
- 3. We must stay grounded in our faith; to that end we need to assess the way we do church and consider are there better ways, more effective ways to be Christ's Church. The break of 10-12 weeks has put the "way we always did it" on pause and gives us a great opportunity to seek new dynamics as we follow Christ and walk in His way. The Futures Committee needs to get back to work and to grapple with the possibilities, suggesting to the Session what our future can be.
- 4. We must be better prepared for the new paradigm that is coming. This means we must engage in studying and building ourselves up in the areas of technology, technique and testimony about our knowledge of God and His perfect model our Christ.

What lies ahead will not be easy, but this break offers an opportunity to re-imagine who we are and whose we are and what we could be for Christ. After all, our mission is not to be a great organization with a great structure; our mission is to tell and live the good news of the Gospel that others might know of the God who loves us and has sent us to be his priests to the world. Let us look at this time-out as an opportunity, an opportunity to grow and change, an opportunity to become better at the job we have been given, an opportunity to become closer to our Lord. My first mentor, Rev. Bill Wilson always ended every encounter with these words: "God loves you and so do I." It is never so obvious as it is in times of crisis.
