

We live in the midst of an epidemic of historic proportions and we cry out, How Long, God, and Where Are You, God? We look beyond us and wonder

where is our help. We are not unique in this feeling. In Psalm 89 God's people in exile cried out 600 years before Christ, God, where are you? God has said, I will never abandon you, and I will always be with you, even to the end of this age. Jesus gave us these comforting words from John 14.

Let not your hearts be troubled; if you believe in God, believe also in me in what I am saying.

In my Father's house are many mansions; if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you, and if I go to prepare a place for you, I will come back for you.

A day is coming when this too shall pass. Until it does, talk daily with our Lord, read from God's word, sing of your faith, and reach out as best you can to each other, and remember that God's love for us will never end. We are God's chosen, members of God's family, sisters and brothers of Christ, and we shall see Christ now in a thousand faces and then, face to face.
