Dear Friends in Christ,

"As you go, preach this message: 'The kingdom of heaven is near.' Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse those who have leprosy, drive out demons. Freely you have received, freely give." Matthew 10:7-8 (NIV)

It can't have escaped anyone's notice that we live in transactional times, and this shouldn't be surprising given that ours is a capitalistic economy. Capitalism encourages us to engage in negotiations for the best price whether we find ourselves shopping for groceries or bargaining for better wages and benefits. It expects us to seek a profit in the marketplace and to maximize that profit wherever possible, leaving us immersed in transactional activity at almost every turn of daily life.

So what does Jesus mean when he says "Freely you have received, freely give." in the above passage from Matthew? This seems contrary to the self-interested individual transactions that inundate us every day. Transactions that count the cost of obtaining what we are selling, whether it be for the education that equips us to earn a living, or for the development and production costs of a product we want to market, against the price we expect in return from those on the receiving end.

When Jesus uttered these words he was addressing the disciples as he prepared to send them out to preach the gospel. He spoke of the unique gifts and talents that they had been given by God through the Spirit and wanted the disciples to understand that as they had not developed these skills on their own they therefore were to share them with the world unstintingly. It was the first among several instructions on how to go about sharing the news that "The kingdom of heaven is near."

We as modern day disciples are thus reminded that all of our blessings, gifts and talents have likewise come from God through the Spirit and that we too are expected to share these freely. This applies to every aspect of our lives including what we share with God's church here at Second. It is here that our gifts and talents in combination with those of our fellow disciples are multiplied in their effectiveness for the spreading of Jesus' message that "The kingdom of heaven is near."

This stewardship season as you ponder what you are able to commit to Second Church in the way of talent, time and tithe please remember that Jesus' instruction in the first century remains just as applicable in our time as we too seek to spread the gospel. "Freely you have received, freely give."
